The extreme geographical surroundings, privileged in terms of the beauty of its landscapes and the intense blue of its always clear sky, make San Pedro one of the most important tourism attractions in Chile. The Atacama Salt Flats, Valley of the Moon, and The Tatio Geysers, are some of the interesting places that you can visit while you are staying in San Pedro, an oasis in the driest desert of the World.



Easter Island is another attraction of Chile. Set in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, 3.700 kilometers from the Chilean mainland, Easter Island, with its huge Moai Statues, is one of the most mysterious places on earth. In 1995 the island, also known as Rapa Nui or Te-Pito-Henúa, was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
